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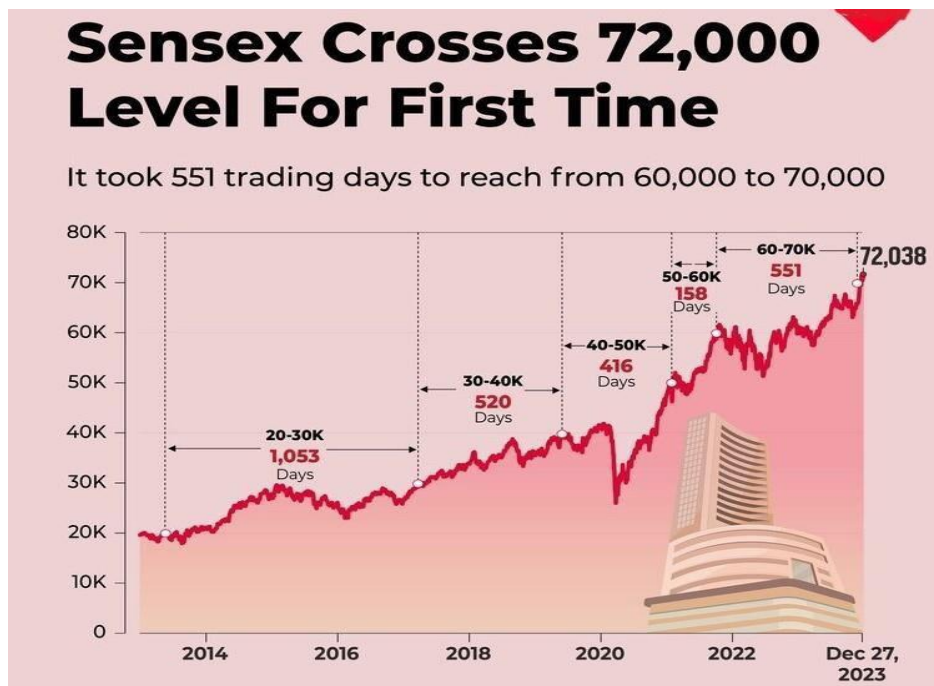

Repatriation: Restoring Heritage of India from The British Museum.

Once known as Sone ki chidiya, 'The Golden Bird', owing to its richness of rare raw resources and cultural legacy, India was a nation that one could only dream of visiting. We were a worldwide commerce centre that supplied spices and silk, and even had our own Nalanda institution that attracted overseas students seeking salvation. From the Mauryans to the Mughals, Bharatvarsh witnessed the rise and fall of empires, lineages of astounding rulers, notorious invading forces, architectural heterogeneity, and, of course, British Imperialism.

The Anglo-Indian Wars culminated in the dethronement of many Indian rulers and the plunder of their royal riches. Tipu Sultan's weaponry, Kunwar Singh's Mace, Maharaja Ranjit Singh's Throne are some of the handfuls of instances whereby the British military has confiscated these possessions as war trophies. Numerous excavation operations were also carried out by the British during their colonial rule. Wherein ruins and scriptures of Nalanda, figurines from Khajuraho, Amaravati marbles and similar artefacts were discovered, and today they rest in the British Museum.

The British Museum was established by King George II and Queen Mary in 1914, but its origins can be traced back to the 1700s in the will of Anglo-Irish physician Sir Hans Sloane. Sloane gathered around 71,000 objects of all kinds which included 40,000 books, 700 manuscripts and specimens of dried plants. The museum now has an internationally acquired collection from numerous civilizations all throughout the world. This massive 92,000-square-metre structure houses approximately 8 million objects dating back 2 million years.

Behind the museum's splendour and reputation lies a dark and crimson history of acquisitions. The showcased artworks are stained by acts of violence, bloodshed, and the drive for colonialism. The sole thing they can do is reinstate them to their roots. Returning looted artefacts to their respective nations is forbidden under the British Museum Act of 1963. And has used that law as a shield to reject repatriation requests.

Another point raised by the Museum is, the origin nations lack the infrastructure to care for the repatriated antiques. According to Anupam Sah, (Art conservation restoration practitioner), "Proactive conservation may be performed even in newly established institutions. India possesses the necessary tools as well as expertise for proactive conservation." Regardless of whether the nations in question have utilities to restore their ancient artefacts, the British Museum might aid the process thus undoing their ancestral wrongs while strengthening their relations to an optimistic future.
